Please also continue to wear a face covering when on the school site.



Attendance



A child was tumbling through the sky, He must have slipped and fallen.


Big Bear ran, dived...



"Wait! I'm Minik! I'm coming with you."





- Flexible thinking to be able to drop one idea for a better one.
- Fluent thinking to be able to generate ideas.
- Originality to be able to see something entirely new.
- Evolutionary and revolutionary thinking to be able to create new ideas through building on existing ideas.

Our KS2 literary character for this characteristic is Roald Dahl's George from "George's Marvellous Medicine". George Is fluent and flexible when he creates his marvellous medicine; he shows great originality to create revolutionary new medicine.
