Dear parents and carers,

Welcome back to what promises to be a busy and exciting half term here at Ravensthorpe. Congratulations to all of our Year 1 children, who this week persevered, worked hard and showed great resilience in their phonics screening check. We have also welcomed Local Authority moderators in school to work with our Year 2 team – they were incredibly impressed by the Year 2 children's beautiful work books – well done Year 2!

Next week we see the first of this term's educational visits. Our Reception children (Owls classes) will be visiting Ferry Meadows for a full day of exploring and learning outdoors. 

In Year 5 and 6, we had a morning exploring the myths of Ancient Greece. We supported each other and were able to translate information in different languages to help each other understand.


