Parents who have a child at the school and who take an active interest in the education of **all children at the school** should consider becoming a parent governor. They should not take on this role to follow up a particular concern about the education of an individual child.

What will parent governors have to do?

- Take an active interest in education
- Give time to find out about the school
- Give time to learn about the role by attending induction training
- Abide by the Code of Conduct and confidentiality
- Undergo pre-appointment checks (DBS) and sign a Declaration of Eligibility form
- Complete a declaration of pecuniary interests
- Undertake safeguarding training
- Attend meetings throughout the year. We hold six Academy
 Committee meetings per year, and may establish sub-committees to
 take responsibility for particular delegated functions including
 complaints and exclusions.
- Visit the school (by prior arrangement and with an agreed focus) to monitor aspects of its work and report back to the Academy Committee.



Elinga in year 2 has achieved her Gold Award in gymnastics, well done!




Well done to Ana, year 3, who has received a certificate for completing Stage 2 in swimming and has now moved up to stage 3.



Medicine in school



Due to health and safety, cough sweets are no longer allowed in school, as they are a choking hazard.

In line with our policy, we are able to administer prescribed medicines, Piriton, Paracetamol (Calpol) and Ibuprofen in school. Parents/Carers **MUST** complete a consent form which can be found under the 'Useful Links' tab on the website. It is the responsibility of the child to come to the office at agreed times for medication.
