

During the afternoon we all took part in a festival, there was a queen, a king, guards and there were slaves to serve our food, the food taster had to taste the food first (- if they lived then the rest of us could eat it!)











The hall was set out and we could choose which activity we started with, there was soap stone carving, bread making, ink making, perfumed wax, canopic jars and wrapping a mummy.

In class, we have been learning about how the Rosetta stone helped archaeologists to decode Egyptian hieroglyphs.



We made our own papyrus paper and wrote our names in hieroglyphs










We learnt about the importance of the River Nile. Ancient Egyptian farmers would use a shaduf to lift water from the river to irrigate their crops







In science, we explored levers to lift heavy loads.

Afterwards, we built our own working models of a shaduf.



The Ancient Egyptians believed in the afterlife.

When they died, they wanted their bodies mummified to preserve them. This involved removing organs and drying out the flesh using Natron, a kind of salt. The mummies of important Egyptians were buried in tombs along with all of the possessions they would need in the next life. Since Year 5 didn't have any dead bodies available, we mummified a tomato! After 4 weeks, they were smaller, lighter and had very wrinkled skin.











Our Destination Reader text this term has been Secrets of a Sun King.





If you drive to school to drop off or collect your child, please make sure you park legally and safely. Do not block paths, roads or our neighbour's driveways.


