Dear Children, Parents and Carers,

I can't believe it is half term already! What a half term it has been and what a lot we have to celebrate. Our EYFS and Key Stage 1 children have been working incredibly hard on their reading skills through phonics. As a school, we use Read Write Inc as our systematic approach to teaching phonics and you may have heard the children refer to 'Fred talk' when reading. Fred is a small, cuddly green frog, who can't read whole words and has to sound them out using his phonics, for example he would say his name is 'f - r - e - d' - this is 'Fred Talk.' To celebrate their incredible focus and hard work, we held a number of Phonics Discos in school this week, with a visit from Fred himself! Thank you to all the staff involved (especially our Freds!)

Our Celebration Cafes have gone from strength to strength and I know the children love sharing their learning with you on those days. Highlights of this term include the amazing Continents song in the Year 2 Café (and the solo!). Year 3 proudly shared more of their fantastic writing and who could forget our Year 1 polar explorers! I can't wait to see what EYFS, Year 4, 5 and 6 share next half term...

I hope you have a great half term and we look forward to seeing you again on Monday 20th February.


