What is bullying?

This week, in our Friday Assemblies in class, we have been talking about bullying as part of our Be Safe focus.

It's important that we know how to recognise bullying. Sometimes, we fall out with our friends, or someone might say something unkind. We should report this to an adult and it will be dealt with in line with our behaviour policy, but this is not bullying.

Bullying is behaviour that hurts someone else. It includes name calling, hitting, pushing, spreading rumours, threatening or undermining someone. It can happen anywhere – at school, at home or online., but it takes place over a period of time and can involve one person or a group of people. It can help to think about this in terms of STOP – several times on purpose.

What will school do?

What should I do if I, or someone I know, is being bullied?

Talk to a trusted adult as soon as you can. This could be an adult in school or at home. If, as parents, your child discloses something, please speak to your class teacher as soon as possible. You can speak to the class teacher either at the end of the day or you can contact the school office to make an appointment. Don't wait until parent's evening.

The class teacher will speak to the child to find out as much as they can. They will then investigate and may take advice from the phase leader as to next steps. The action taken will focus on:

- Supporting the child who has been bullied
- To put in place educational and protective consequences and support all of the children involved in carrying out the bullying. An educational consequence would be for those children to work with an adult on the impact of bullying on others. A protective consequence could be having a separate break or lunch time, if appropriate.
- To contact and talk to the parents/carers of all children involved.
- To repair and restore relationships – understanding that this can take time.
- To continue to check-in with the victim

As a parent, who can I talk to if I am worried about my child?

The first person to contact should always be the class teacher, but you can also take to our Family Support Team. Mrs Ryder and Mrs Mac are available at the start and end of each day and appointments can also be made via the office.

I've spoken to the class teacher, but I'm still worried. What should I do ?

We want to work with families to resolve any concerns as soon as possible. If, after speaking to the class teacher you are still concerned, please contact the office to talk to Mrs Cannon (EYFS – Y2) or Mrs Bush (Y3-6).

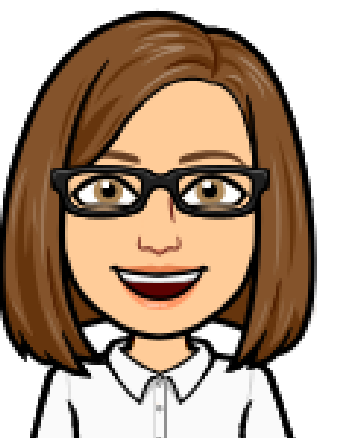

Classes of the Week!

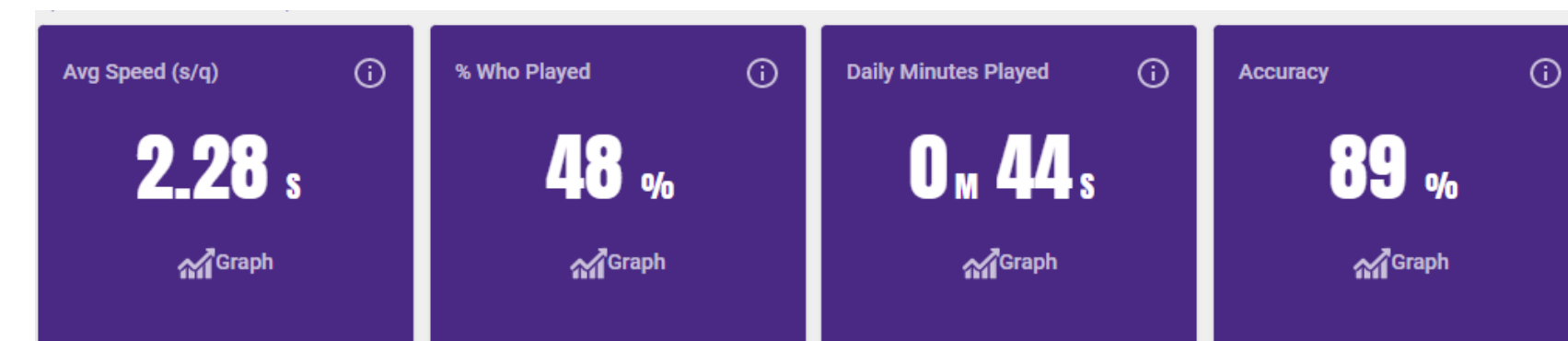
Last week, our challenge was to find the most prepared class in the school. The class where everyone was in the correct uniform, on the correct days
