Online relationships

Our topic in the Keeping Safe curriculum is Online Relationships. How can you help your child with this challenging topic?

From gaming platforms to social networks and other platforms, digital technology allows us to stay in touch and develop relationships with others. However, not all nline interactions are oositive.

Teaching children the differences between healthy nd unhealthy relationships can help them to build ositive, respectful elationships with others online. It can also help hildren and young people ecognise risk, make udgements on who to trust and where to get help if they are worried.

Many of the themes are revisited many times across the years from EYFS to Year 6 and this is to ensure that children develop a deep understanding of the difference between healthy and unhealthy online relationships.

WHAT IS BEREAL?

Real is a new social media app. It notifies you once a day to upload image of what you are doing. Once you receive the notification, yo ve two mins to capture and share what you are doing at that iment. All your friends post at the exact same time. Once you have sted, you can then see what your friends have posted. If you don't st your BeReal, then you can't see your friend's BeReals from that lay or access the discovery tab.

WHAT DO I NEED TO BE AWARE OF?

- You must be 13+ to use BeReal. Users add their date of birth to register (no age verification take)
- Jsers and their date of birth to register (no age verification takes Jace) although users do need to add a mobile number. BeReal is private by default and only visible to your friends. However, it is possible to share with all users by selecting the pub pytion. If selected, your BeReal will appear in the Discovery tab fo ill users to see and interact with here is also an option to share your location. If you don't enable our location, then your can't see other user's locations. Chat to you

How can parents and carers help?

Each term, we will send out a newsletter sharing what the children are learning in their Keeping Safe lessons. This is an ideal opportunity for you to talk to your child about these issues. When things arise in school, we will also send out information to year groups so that you can support your child at home to keep themselves safe. We know it is hard, especially when children say 'but all my friends have xxxx', but there are reasons for the age limits on social media sites such as instagram and snapchat. The most important thing you can do as parents is keep talking to your children, reassuring them that they can talk to you about any concerns and ensuring that you know what they are doing when they are online.

As a school, it is difficult for us to deal with issues that occur online out of school, but if you are concerned, please contact the office to speak to our pastoral team.
