Dear parents, carers and children,



Welcome to this week's Feel Good Friday Newsletter.

Over the past couple of weeks in school, we have been reflecting on changes that we have made in school this year and some changes that are yet to come. Our priorities for this year have been around improving progress and attainment in maths, developing subject leadership for foundation subjects and embedding the new RPS Way and our behaviour policy. More information on our progress so far can be found later in this newsletter.

One ongoing priority from last year was to continue to find ways, after the Pandemic to welcome parents back into school. Our next whole school event is our Coronation Picnic next Friday – tickets are available now! As well as the picnic and a free sports activities and facepainting, there will be tombolas, a book stall, uniform stall and a plant stall. We would love to see you there. To support the tombolas, we will be celebrating Star Wars Day on May 4th. Children can dress in star wars themed outfits, or their own clothes in return for a donation. Rather than money we are asking for items for our tombola: children in KS1 can donate a pack of sweets (share size pack of Haribo for example) and children in KS2 can donate a bottle of non-alcoholic drink (for example a 2 litre bottle of lemonade.) 

How can I help my child?

We know it can be hard, especially if you are not confident with maths, but it is important that we don't say 'I don't like/can't do maths'. BBC bitesize have lots of guides to maths that you can use with your child to understand different concepts. Talking to your child about money while out shopping and getting them to add together items, or work out change, asking them to tell you the time and providing time to practice their number bonds or times tables will all really help

Our Learning Priority this year is linked to maths. We want to ensure that all of our children leave Ravensthorpe as confident mathematicians. We all use maths every day: whether it is while out shopping, working out what time we need to be somewhere or working out how to get somewhere.

To achieve this priority, we have:

- Introduced the White Rose Maths across the school.
- Developed a revised calculation policy and linked times tables progression policy.
- Ensured that we have a 15-minute mental maths/fluency session each day.
- We are developing a new approach to teaching times tables, starting in Year 4.
- We have ensured that reasoning and problem-solving are included in every maths lesson.

Our next steps include assessing the impact of our times tables approach and developing a whole school approach to fluency in fraction. Over the summer term we will also be surveying the children to see how they feel about maths this year.





How can I help my child?

Later this term we will be inviting you into school for our Celebrating Learning Cafes – instead of an assembly, we would love you to join us to take part in an foundation curriculum activity with your child. You might be creating a masterpiece in art, building map skills in geography or developing a working product in design and technology. We are really exciting to share the children's learning with you – look out fo the dates which will be announced soon!



Our Leadership Priority this year is about developing leadership of our foundation subjects (art, design and technology, history, geography, modern foreign languages, PE, religious education and science.)

To achieve this priority, we have:

- Across PKAT, teachers now have access to the United Learning Curriculum, which has been designed by subject specialists and follows the National Curriculum.
- We have continued to develop our text-based approach, with high-quality books linked to each theme.
- We are developing action plans for each subject to support the ongoing development of the foundation curriculum.
- Staff have met with other staff across our Trust to share ideas and approaches.

Our next steps include assessing the impact of the United Learning Curriculum, going to see this curriculum in action at another primary school and reviewing each of our termly themes to ensure that they support all children to explore succeed and soar.













How can I help my child?

Ask your child about Class Dojo – our way of rewarding children for following the RPS Way. Our half termlly Keeping Safe newsletter can be a great starting point for discussing online safety with your child





Our Personal Best priority is to embed the RPS Way and our revised behaviour policy across the school.

To achieve this priority we have:

- Used our training days to provide support for staff on the behaviour policy.
- Ensured the RPS Way is visible across the school and used in class, in corridors and in assemblies (and of course in this newsletter!)
- Celebrated those children who demonstrate the RPS Way, whether that is being respectful, prepared or safe.
- We have introduced the Keeping Safe curriculum to ensure children have a thorough understanding of online safety.

Our next steps include revising our policy to include behaviour that takes place outside of school (for example on the way to school in the morning.) We will be training more staff as Steps Trainers (Steps, is used across the Trust and Peterborough/Cambridgeshire) to support children to understand and improve their behaviour). We will then be revisiting Steps as part of our whole-school training in September.













How can I help my child?

It has been wonderful to see so many of you at our Celebration Cafes and we hope you will join us this term at our Celebrating Learning events (there will still be coffee and cake!)

For our parents in EYFS and Key Stage 1 – pleease ensure you can sign in to Seesaw as we use this to share updates on your children's learning. Ask the class teacher if you are not sure.

Attendance across the school is improving, so please continue to ensure you are on time and that children are in school every day.

Our ongoing community priority is to build in more opportunities to welcome parents into school after the pandemic.

To achieve this priority we have:

- Introduced our Celebration Cafes, with up to 50 parents attending each one.
- Reintroduced our Mother's Day breakfast, which was so popular we had to put on a second session!
- We have trialed offering both online and face-to-face parents evenings.
- We have changed our Feel Good Friday newsletter to this format, which we hope is easier to read on any device.
- We are offering whole-school events such as our upcoming Coronation Picnic.

Our next steps include our Celebrating Learning Cafes this term, supporting all parents across EYFS and Key Stage 1 to access Seesaw to share in their child's learning and see important updates from the class teacher. We will also be surveying parents later this term and would love to hear your ideas about what more we can do.


This week, we are back to celebrating those children who have demonstrated being respectful. After last week's focus on the environment, this week it is on those children who demonstrate excellent manners in and around school.
