School Uniform

Uniform Years 1-5

- White polo shirt
- Dark green jumper/sweatshirt or cardigan
- Dark grey trousers, skirt or pinafore
- Black or grey tights or socks
- Black shoes
- Long hair should be tied back using plain green or black hair ties (no decorative hairbands or bows)





Our School Uniform is an important part of our RPS identity. Wearing the correct uniform helps children feel like they are part of the school and class family. It forms part of our RPS Way (being prepared) and ensures that children are ready for when they move on to secondary school.

From September, we want everyone to be wearing the right uniform on the right days. We will be contacting parents where this is not the case and asking you to bring the correct uniform to school. We also have some spare uniform available if needed.


Children should not be wearing t-shirts or tops with slogans at any time. This includes PE Days.

We have worked hard to ensure that our uniform is as affordable as possible. Children can wear items with the school logo, which are available from Chroma Sports, but can also wear plain tops and jumpers which are widely available at supermarkets.

From September, we will not longer be using hooded tops as part of our uniform. We understand that some children may have logo versions from this year that they may still fit into. These can still be worn, but for future PE uniform (and from September 2025) only plain black sweatshirts will be allowed.

Uniform for Year 6 only

- White Shirt or Blouse
- Dark Grey Jumper or Cardigan
- Dark grey trousers, skirt or pinafore
- Black or grey tights or socks
- Black shoes
- Long hair should be tied back using plain green or black hair ties (no decorative hairbands or bows)









PE Days will be confirmed with each year group. Year 4 children will also need a swimming costume for their weekly swimming lessons and a swim hat.

Children in Key Stage 1 (Years 1 and 2) should bring their book bag each day. Children in Year 3-6 should bring a bag for their reading books and, in Year 6, their individual school iPads.




As this week has been Sports Week, our RPS stars have to be our Sports Coaches! Led by Mr Blanchard, we couldn't have done this without you – thank you!


